#### **Alice Guss “Tsawaysia Spukwus”**

Tsawaysia is a member of the Squamish Nation who is committed to participating in all aspects of her culture, including traditional language studies, art and film making, drumming, dancing and storytelling. She has been a participant in the healing Tribal Journeys and for over 20 years has been an educator and guest speaker. She has also provided innovative Squamish Nation weaving and drum making learning experiences for the whole community.

This workshop will offer a special hands-on opportunity to engage in authentic Squamish Nation craft and proudly wear or play the end product.



### **Herbal Medicine & Basket Weaving**

#### **Diana Billy “Tuctucnei”**

Tuctucnei is the daughter of hereditary Chiefs of the Squamish Nation. She keeps her Coast Salish customs and culture alive by teaching young people at the Squamish Nation Bighouse. She believes we can learn many things from the earth including how to heal oneself using natural herbal remedies. Diana is also a master of traditional Squamish Nation cedar bark weaving and she will share her skills and knowledge with workshop participants who will create their own cedar baskets.
